On September 19th, our Clínica Amistad family said goodbye to Co-Founder, Hugh Richard Elford. Known as "Padre" or "Father Ricardo", he was the heart and soul of our clinic and a champion to our patients as he worked tirelessly to serve the healthcare needs of our community.


In 2003, with Dr. Evan Kligman and Susan Gallegos, Clínica Amistad was started to help those in the community with no healthcare coverage and in need of medical attention. This was consistent with his concern to address unmet needs and his desire to help the underserved. Founder Evan Kligman stated, "I met Ricardo in 2001, when I entered Seminary in Tucson, and he was a key faculty teacher. He had the "biggest heart" of any human I have ever known on this earth, figuratively speaking! Ricardo and his Spirit will remain the "heart" of Clínica Amistad. I think Ricardo felt that Clínica was the most meaningful and important responsibility and spiritual "work" he had ever done. We are all blessed to have known Ricardo."

Father Ricardo was a fierce but gentle warrior and compassionate soul that was deeply committed to social justice and a campion of our efforts to serve the healthcare needs of the underserved in our community. Dr. Rick Graap worked side by side with Padre for over a decade, "It was my great privilege to work with him during hundreds of clinic sessions. He was the very best in all ways that one would ever find in a human being."

Padre was industrious, a "fixer" and "facilitator" who found solutions to the many problems that we presented to him. With relatives over the border, crises in healthcare needs, financial and legal difficulties; he usually found some approach to ease the problem. Padre had a purpose to help others no matter what; he lived his truth and his purpose.

Fr. Ricardo is fondly remembered by all volunteers and staff, who provide or have provided support and healthcare to the people that Padre was called to help. It is through Padre's indirect influence that moves many of us to continue to serve our uninsured community.

As Dr. Kligman reminds us, "In many ways he was blessed to have our volunteers, staff, and Board members working together to develop, evolve, nurture, and sustain Clínica for over 20 years, and "still" counting. Along with our volunteers, staff, and Board, Father Ricardo has played a critically important role in stabilizing, growing, and evolving Clínica into the "top tier" of free clinics in the US."





















HOW YOUR SUPPORT MAKES A DIFFERENCE IN OUR COMMUNITY

MONTHLY RECAP

In the month of September we saw 173 patients. There were 20 licensed healthcare providers providing 145 total licensed hours at the clinic. A total of 469 volunteer hours included the licensed providers in addition to 39 students in various healthcare fields at the University of Arizona and Pima Community College.
