





## Who we serve




Clínica Amistad is a free health clinic that serves anyone who cannot afford or qualify for health insurance. Our patients are largely lowincome individuals living below the poverty line who would otherwise be unable to receive medical care. Many of them have not had medical evaluations for chronic health conditions, and few are able to purchase medications outside of the clinic.

## Who we serve: Patient demographics









### Did not graduate high school--39.8%







The majority of our patients fall below the national poverty level, which was defined in 2018 as an income of less than \$16,240 for a household of two.

## Read about one of our recent patients!

This year, a middle-aged man with a concerning mass in his chest approached Clínica Amistad. He was between jobs and didn't have insurance, but required a physical exam and chest x-ray for a new job. With no insurance and little money to afford a doctor's visit, he came to Clínia Amistad. Fortunately, an exam revealed that the mass was a fat pad, not a tumor. Because of Clínica Amistad, he was approved to begin his new job. and of those without insurance

have NEVER had health insurance


## What we do: Clinic visits




#### Total Number of Appointments Per Fiscal Year



#### Types of Referrals in 2018





#### Appointments versus walk-in visits






## What we do: Monetary value of clinic services
