Dear Clínica Amistad Patrons and Friends,

The past year has been a success in many ways, but also a year of challenge.

We continued to fulfill our mission to provide free primary medical care and associated services to a vulnerable population of greater Tucson. We advanced our partnership with the University of Arizona, knowing well that our student volunteers are invaluable. And we increased our group of clinic personnel, currently having 51 licensed providers on our roster. Finally, thanks to you, our financial resources grew.

In regard to monetary funding, we were selected to receive a generous grant, in perpetuity, from the Stonewall Foundation. Founded in 1975, this foundation has provided annual funding to Tucson based nonprofits for more than 45 years. We are honored that Clínica is now part of the Stonewall Foundation family, and we look forward to partnering with them to help those who have "fallen through the cracks" of the healthcare system.

In addition to funding, we earned several awards last year. Most noteworthy was the Andy Nichol's Award, presented by Arizona Governor Doug Ducey. The honor noted our dedication to the health and well being of residents of the Arizona-Sonora region.

Over the past 16 years of operation, the clinic has, in fact, seen more than 20,000 needy people, all free of cost to them. We have helped this underserved population, providing accessible and competent care. But we have done this only because of the financial donations and volunteer assistance from people like you. In fact, maintaining financial viability is the biggest challenge facing the clinic. That is why we work so diligently to secure contributions from all sources.


But please understand, you, the individual donor, continue to be of most importance. You are the soul of our clinic.

Clínica Amistad is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization and is supported by grants, private donations, patient donations, and contributions from generous community partners.








The majority of our patients are low-income individuals living below the poverty line; most do not have insurance and **would otherwise be unable to receive medical care.** Many of them have not had medical evaluations for chronic health conditions, and few are able to purchase medications outside of the clinic.

CLINIC VISITS

Clínica Amistad provides many in-clinic services such as: medical evaluations and treatments, dermatology screenings, diabetes management and education, social services support, referrals to community specialists, and acupuncture, bowen work, and physical therapy. Appointments can be made in advance, or patients may be seen on a "walk-in" basis. As 63% of patients prefer to speak Spanish, many volunteers are bilingual and interpreters are available as needed.

Patients can also be referred to speciality providers in the community, or for lab tests or other diagnostic studies (X-ray, ultrasound, etc.).







