Dear Friends and Patrons of Clínica Amistad,

To say this year has been difficult is an understatement. It's been trying for every individual and institution in this nation, as well as in the entire world. Yet, we continue on.

For Clínica Amistad, that has meant keeping our doors open as a free, primary healthcare facility. In fact, in these times we feel it is even more important to help the poor and underserved. We have not altered our hours of operation. We have, however, instituted a number of precautions in accordance with federal, state and local rules regarding the Covid-19 pandemic.

We've been able to continue operating for two major reasons.

First, we have a dedicated number of unpaid professionals—doctors, nurses and others in the healthcare field. In addition, we have volunteers assisting with other duties. Many of these volunteers are enrolled at the University of Arizona in various healthcare studies.

Second, we have received tremendous financial support in the form of contributions and grants. This includes a one-time, very large emergency contribution from the Stonewall Foundation, which was given along with our annual grant. Pima County joined our growing list of contributors. And the City of Tucson has assisted us during these difficult times. Late in 2019, we hosted our annual gala dinner, which included honoring U.S. Representative Raúl Grijalva and his wife, Ramona, for all that they have done for the people of the greater Tucson area. This event was sponsored in part by Southwest Gas, Desert Diamond Casinos and Entertainment, and several generous individuals. Finally, we continue to receive generous and very welcome contributions from many donors and institutions.

Indeed, people like you are the very soul of our clinic.

Because of you, Clínica Amistad looks forward to its 17th year of service. In so doing, we pledge to continue upholding our mission, which is "to provide free primary and integrative healthcare to those in our community who are without health insurance and unable to pay for these services."

To provide **free primary health care**, **preventive services**, **and education** to those in need and without access to health care throughout the greater Tucson area.










