# Dignitaries Salute Clínica Amistad during 15th Anniversary Celebration

Many government officials, including one from Mexico, helped celebrate Clínica Amistad's 15th anniversary on December 8, 2018. The Quinceañera included an open house and tour of the facilities, located at 101 W. Irvington Road, Tucson. Approximately 100 people attended the morning to early afternoon event.

All guest speakers noted the importance of the clinic, which has provided free primary medical care and associated services for 15 years to people lacking health insurance or the means to get it. Through the years, the clinic has aided more than 20,000 people at no cost to them. And all this has been possible because of the financial and volunteer help received from people like you.

Mexico's Consul to the U.S., the honorable Ricardo Pineda Albarran, attended the event and spoke highly of the need for such a clinic.

He was followed at the podium by U.S. Rep. Raúl Grijalva, who stressed the importance of care for the poor and underserved. Many of his constituents, in fact, seek medical care at the clinic.

Following the congressman were Arizona State Senator Olivia Cajero Bedford, State Representative-elect Andrés Cano, County Supervisor Richard Elías, Tucson Mayor Jonathan Rothschild and Councilwoman Regina Romero.

During his remarks, Mayor Rothschild issued a proclamation that read, in part:

Whereas, for over 15 years, Clínica Amistad has been meeting the primary care medical needs of over 1,000 patients each year and keeping these individuals healthy, employable and able to care and provide for their families.

Now, therefore, I, Jonathan Rothschild, Mayor of the City of Tucson, Arizona, do hereby proclaim Saturday, December 8, 2018, to be Clínica Amistad's Quinceañera in



this community and encourage all of our residents to join us in support of their important mission.

## Patient Speaks Out at Anniversary

Quite unexpectedly, another speaker took center stage during the celebration. She was a patient, who, on her own, wanted to express her gratitude to Clínica Amistad.

Here, in part, are her words, translated from Spanish: "I am one of the patients of this clinic, and on behalf of all the people who receive this service, I want to thank everyone – everyone! – who works here for everything. I hope that this clinic grows, and the people who have the resources can continue to support this clinic so that it can be bigger and even better. May God bless you."

## Key Facts about Who We Serve

The latest statistics for Clínica Amistad show that the number of free appointments per year have increased by 102% since 2013, the first year such statistics were compiled.

In the fiscal year from July 1, 2017 to June 20, 2018, providers and other medical staff held 2,259 appointments, with the clinic being open on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, and one Saturday morning every month.

Of those coming to the clinic, 70% are women. Most patients are from 41 to 60 years of age, with our oldest being 94 and nearly 85% are of Hispanic heritage.

About 42% of the clinic's patients are employed, yet 97% lack insurance. Furthermore, some 61% fall below the federal poverty level, which is defined as yearly income of \$16,240 for a household of two.

Concerning education, 53% have had some high school or graduated from high school, while 20% have less than a high school education. Patients with some college or college diplomas total 27%.

There are 35-40 licensed healthcare providers who volunteer time at the clinic. Other volunteers number more than 60, with many being students in various healthcare fields at the University of Arizona and Pima Community College.

The clinic is overseen by a volunteer board of directors. The medical director is Dr. Raymond Graap. ■
